

I. Overview and Recommendations

- The Grand Lake Yacht Club has established a Covid-19 Task force, which is made up of the Board of Directors.
- The club will comply with all federal, state, local and CDC guidelines for safe operations, including group sizes and distancing guidelines.
- The club will be open limited hours and will be locked when not in use
- The club safety officer will be Bill Meyer

II. Signage, Communications, Waivers.

- Member communications will be posted on the club website
- Important information will be displayed on signs at the club property
- A Covid-19 guidelines enforcement policy is that a member may inform a board member about any infractions to ensure the violator(s) are notified where possible and are informed about these Covid-19 guidelines.

III. PPE Protocol

- Face coverings/cloth masks will be required while on club grounds based on current government guidelines.
- Disposable gloves are recommended while cleaning/sanitizing
- IV. Health and Safety Recommendations
  - Anyone who is unwell should not come to the club
  - If a person feels sick or has a temperature of 100.4°F or higher they should stay home
  - All members/guests should thoroughly wash hands before arriving and immediately after leaving.
  - Members are asked to BYO water and water bottles when coming to the club. Water bottles should be filled at home.
  - Members should use caution, be courteous and practice safe social distancing (6ft) when passing others on docks and in tight locations
  - Members should use bathrooms prior to coming to the club whenever possible
  - Members should BYO masks, gloves, hand sanitizer whenever possible



V. Cleaning of Common Touch -Points

- The club will follow CDC guidelines for cleaning/disinfecting
- All common surfaces such as tables, counters, equipment, hoses, door knobs, gates, handles, benches, chairs, dock lines should be cleaned regularly.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be set up around the club.
- Cleaning check lists will be posted in the bathrooms, the kitchen, and other areas as needed
- Appropriate cleaning products will be made available, as well as disposable gloves and masks to be used while cleaning

VI. Access to Indoor Facilities and Restrooms

- When the club is open, capacity will be limited so that safe social distancing can be maintained
- Restrooms will be limited to one person at a time
- Members should clean surfaces after use whenever possible
- Access to facilities may be restricted to unnecessary use by outside visitors
- Access to unused inside areas will be blocked.

VII. Docks, slips and club grounds

- All people on the grounds, docks and ramps should maintain safe social distancing of at least 6ft
- Group sizes on docks and club grounds should comply with federal, state and local guidelines. The designated safety officers will enforce these rules
- All unnecessary furniture will be removed from accessible areas in the buildings and on the grounds. Furniture should not be moved unless directed by a club officer
- Members should pay special attention to trash disposal around the facility and club grounds, making sure all is disposed of correctly
- Members should use disinfecting wipes or cleaning products after using surfaces in the club or on the grounds
- Limit access to docks/slips to people boarding boats.



VIII. Shared equipment

- Carts, ladders, hoses, grills and other shared equipment should be cleaned by members who use them, using disinfectant wipes or cleaning products
- Items which cannot be properly cleaned after use will be removed
- Shared/self service ice machines and coolers should not be used. Members should provide their own ice and beverages
- Whenever possible, members should provide BYO lines, tools,carts, equipment.
- Life jackets and other personal equipment should not be left at the club
- All shared equipment should be cleaned according to CDC guidelines after use and proper PPE should be worn while cleaning
- The club kitchen area will be closed until further notice, including use of dishes, utensils and all non-disposable items

#### IX .Outdoor dining

- Members should avoid direct hand-off of food or sharing food and drinks
- Safe distancing (6ft) should be maintained at all times
- All furniture and surfaces touched should be cleaned before and after use, following CDC guidelines., using proper PPE
- Members are not allowed to move furniture provided for outdoor use
- Members should limit group size to meet federal, state and local guidelines
- X. On-site Health Screening
  - The club may use health screenings and temperature checks in special circumstances as an optional strategy for managing risk. If used, screening will follow CDC guidelines, and will be done by someone with appropriate knowledge and skills to perform the tasks correctly.
  - Members are responsible for ongoing monitoring of the health of all family members. Anyone who feels ill, has a fever over 100.4, or has Covid-19 symptoms is required to stay home.



XI. Response to potential Covid-19 exposure

- In the event anyone who has been at the club is symptomatic or tests positive for Covid-19, the safety officer or another member of the task force should be informed. The safety officer will then assess the situation and decide whether the club will reach out to Grand County officials, inform them of the situation, and proceed as directed.
- This response may include closing the club for appropriate cleaning, following CDC guidelines.
- The task force will inform the membership of the situation as directed by county health officials.

XII. PPE and Sanitation supplies

- The task force will maintain PPE supplies for cleaning purposes. This will include CDC-recommended cleaning products and disposable gloves to be used for cleaning.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be provided in addition to requests that members have their own whenever possible
- The club asks members to supply their own face masks to be used at all times in the club
